LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Aspen Forward 2026–2030 is our roadmap for the next chapter, and I want to be honest with you about why this particular plan feels significant to me.

WORKFORCE HOUSING

Workforce housing remains one of the most pressing challenges facing Aspen's business community. With significant initiatives underway at both the city and county level, ACRA will stay engaged, connect employers with resources and advocate for solutions that keep our workforce in the valley.

MAJOR COMMUNITY PROJECTS

Projects like Lift 1A and ongoing housing initiatives will reshape neighborhoods and visitor experiences over the coming years. ACRA will help businesses stay informed and prepared.

New office space, modern visitor centers and enhanced airport guest services will strengthen ACRA's ability to serve businesses and visitors.
